## PUBLIC COMMENT:

Kathleen Gilmore questioned the solicitor bill in excess of \$7K and wants to know what the bill entailed.

Kathy Wright-Croft states the minutes from the March 10, 2022 and the section that talks about Mr. Riggle stated he would comment on his comment but he's not allowed to talk at the meetings and Mrs. Fiddler asked why not he is a tax payer, so the question that she has is without corrections and things like this, it looks like the Township is discriminating and I do not believe that they were. She wasn't sure if the Police wages are being paid out of ACT 13. On #4 on the agenda it just says interiums and I wasn't sure as there is no explanation and wasn't sure what interims is. Jim stated that was interim taxes. Wright-Croft states the pension audit says move to an approved pension plan and she didn't know if there was one specified or you sorta random under new business #1 and I would ask the Township; knows the previous auditors were in the surcharge case they had the insurance company attorney representing them and

Vreeland was representing them and now the Township is involved and she doesn't know if there is a reason to pay Vreeland and the Township attorney and she saying she would like to see the Township drop Vreeland but also not sure if you can or not, I know it was in December there was a motion made to Vreeland would represent the old auditors but there is a lot of lawyers for a case.

JD Martin says we discussed at the agenda meeting the mess up on Lake Rd, the back up and flooding and I thought you were gonna ask the Secretary to send a letter and contact the Conservation District and didn't see anything on the agenda so didn't know if action was taken. Some time ago he thinks Mr. Fidler and Mrs. Iams was in charge of setting up a town hall meeting with the mine and it's a public service and thinks the residents should be well informed and know what is going on and it needs to be addressed; they should be brought in; spokesman come next meeting and do an informational meeting. Mrs. Iams stated that she did ask them to come and they declined; no reason but has an email. JD asked her to forward to Heather to have on file. Mr. Shingle says when he talked to them, you as a resident call or stop down there and they say they are open to that; that's what they told him.

Mr. Bauer states the elected officials sitting up here have a fiduciary commitment to the Township to do what's best in the interest of the Township which is why whenever there are any situations that may have any ramifications that we run it through the solicitor's office and we will continue to do that if there is a chance it will cost the Township money we will run it through the solicitor's office first. As you saw we had an executive session with PIRMA and a little bit of information from that: in 2020 are liability insurance was \$40,368.00 in 2021 it went to \$70,978.00 and in 2022 are estimated premium is \$105,000.00 with the first \$20,000 of any claim being a deductible to the Township. Up to this point, claims paid in insurance company with outstanding litigations, open claims the insurance company has paid \$441,438.45 and the Township will spend \$35,843.19 (not been billed yet) in those numbers were 2 attempts to overturn the election that the residents voted on, the insurance company paid \$47,466.26 to represent that and that will be an expense to the Township of \$11,866.57. Mr. Polan and I climbed on this ship in January and it was a sinking ship, the 3 of us have done the best we can the last 3 months to fill the holes and plug the holes in the ship but there seems to be a group that wants to keep shooting holes in the ship, until that stops we are not going to get this Township moving in the right direction that it needs to, everyone says they care about the Township, it's time we start showing that and acting that way instead of causing unnecessary expenses to the Township.
