Jim Bauer stated that our current web site is out dated and has wrong information on it so we decided to shut it down. We have researched this and it is considered professional services but we still called around and got quotes from Companies.

Jamie Schaller - the Civic Plus Quote is typed wrong. This quote is \$17,086.00 not \$15,036.00

Ed Shingle – this is more of a management tool and not just a website.

Jim Bauer – I wanted to explain this a little bit, we looked at three companies 1) Revize, 2) Townweb and, 3) Civic Plus. We like Civic Plus they will meet the needs of the Township, this website will be user friendly and much more information will be able to go on it than before.

Ed Shingle made the motion to approve purchasing the website from Civic Plus \$17,086.00 and to pay for the purchase out of the ARPA Fund. Randy Polan second. Motion Carried 3/0.

4. The Volunteer Fire Department would like to have the Community Center for a Comedy Night February 17, 2024.

Jim Bauer stated that the Fire Department had helped with some work and in return we would let them use the gym a couple times a year in return.

5. ESM Training August 16 & 17, 2023 (Dirt/Gravel Roads)

Jim Bauer - we discussed who we wanted to go and that would be Scott Dorsey, Heath Malson and Jamie Schaller

Randy Polan made the motion to approve Scott Dorsey, Heath Malson and Jamie Schaller to attend the Dirt and Gravel Training on August 16th & 17th. Jim Bauer second. Motion Carried 3/0.

6. Jeremy Wiley – 107 Main Street West Alexander, received a code violation letter from Mark Gordon regarding the fence and sidewalk.

The Board is going to look at an address at next month's meeting.

1. Salt Purchase

Discussing how much salt we may need or want to purchase from COSTARS. We are required to purchase 60% of what we state we need.

Randy Polan made the motion to approve the purchase of 44 Tons of Salt from COSTARS. Jim Bauer second. Motion Carried 3/0.

2. RTK Officer

The Board discussing appointing the Lynch Law Group as the RTK Officer.

Ed Shingle - Asked Jim McGraw if he could take on?

Jim McGraw – yes this is not uncommon.

Jim Bauer made the motion to appoint the Lynch Law Group as the RTK Officer moving forward from this evening. Ed Shingle second. Motion Carried 3/0.

3. Hiring Part Time Road Crew Employees

Randy Polan made the motion to hire Joshua Rush as a Part Time Road Crew Member according to the status quo term of the expired CBA, subject to the completion of all Township employment requirements. Ed Shingle second. Jim Bauer stated it has been moved and second. Roll Call Vote: Ed Shingle Yes; Jim Bauer Abstain; Randy Polan Yes. Motion Carried 2/1

Jim Bauer asked for any other motions.

Rany Polan made the motion to hire Noah Dorsey as a Part Time Road Crew Member according to the status quo term of the expired CBA, subject to the completion of all Township employment requirements. Ed Shingle second. Jim Bauer stated it has been moved and second. Roll Call Vote: Ed Shingle Yes; Jim Bauer Yes; Randy Polan Yes. Motion Carried 3/0.

4. CAPRI- Support Letter

Jim McGraw – I added some language that Ed and I discussed. Their last line of the letter states about funding so that is why I added at the end that we support the project but in no way does this commit us to a contract, obligation or financial commitment.

Kathy Prescott – I am the secretary for CAPRI and that line requesting funding is we have contracted with HRG to write a grant which the letter is in reference to. Someone had to make the request for the grant.

Ed Shingle made the motion to approve the revised support letter for CAPRI. Randy Polan second. Motion Carried 3/0.

5. Water Meter at the Fair Grounds needs connected to main line.

Discussing what contractors could be contacted for this service.

Jim Bauer made the motion to solicit companies to do the tap in at the fairgrounds with the cost not to exceed \$2,500.00. Ed Shingle second. Motion Carried 3/0.

6. Quote from Industrial Pump and Motor Repair for Tunnel Street pump \$10,349.25

Ed Shingle - I talked to John Forris today and he thinks we should get this in and install it, pull the old one and have it rebuilt and have it as a backup.

Ed Shingle made the motion to purchase the pump out of the Water & Sewer Fund. Randy Polan second. Motion Carried 3/0.

7. Asbestos Monitoring

Ed Shingle – We thought we had in squared away and I think it is still on track but they needed to take a second sample. They came to the building for a second sample. I got an email today that neither of the collection points are registered with DEP, the engineer is on top of it.

Ed Shingle made the motion to comply with the asbestos testing that is being required by DEP on the water not to exceed \$1,000.00. Randy Polan second. Motion Carried 3/0.
